**Public Hearing - Capital Improvement Element & Short-Term Work Program (Resolution)** - Town Manager, Ellen Walls briefly outlined this Resolution of the Brooks Comprehensive Growth Management Plan. Current projects include repair & replacement of the downtown sidewalks, improvements to BAR fields & walking/biking paths along Norfolk Southern Railway line. No comments or questions from public present. Scott Israel made a Motion to approve this Resolution. Lewis Harper offered a Second. Vote was unanimous, all in favor.

Mayor's Report - None

Planning and Zoning - Maurice Ungaro was not present. Ellen Walls presented a property sale/division for approval (Banks/Goodman on Brooks Road). House has also been approved for corner of Hwy 85 Connector & Railroad Street.

Recreation - Mr. Darby Holliman was present from BAR. Baseball Opening Day parade is scheduled for Saturday, March 23rd. They have had good sign up numbers so far, especially from younger ages. Financial information was received and distributed.

Clerk's Report - Farmers' Market vendor applications now being accepted. Name will remain the same but moving to 4th Saturday of each month instead of 3rd to coincide with other events in town. Also, 2 "bonus" days for vendors will be March 23rd for the baseball parade and May 4th for Red Clay Festival.

Manager's Report - Financial information was presented to Mayor and Council. Julia's Crossing project still to be finished up, weather permitting. Notice to Proceed given on Cemetery work (parking lot, water and irrigation). Seeding, sod, trees, etc. will be added at a later date. Downtown parking lot has been completed; town banners have been added including one to mark Town Hall & one for Downtown Parking. F150 has been ordered for town business. GA Tech Cycling annual bike race will take place on Saturday, March 9th, pending Sheriff Department approval; will involve Price, Bankstown, Brooks-Woolsey, Grant, W. McIntosh, Mask, Morgan Mill and Brooks

Roads. 3 Council positions open for re-election this year; qualifying in August. One question was asked about Town t-shirts to match banners; will look into prices.

**Any Other Business:** A question was raised about a proposed subdivision on Woods Road. Maurice Ungaro, Brooks' Zoning Administrator, is handling this issue; nothing definite yet.
